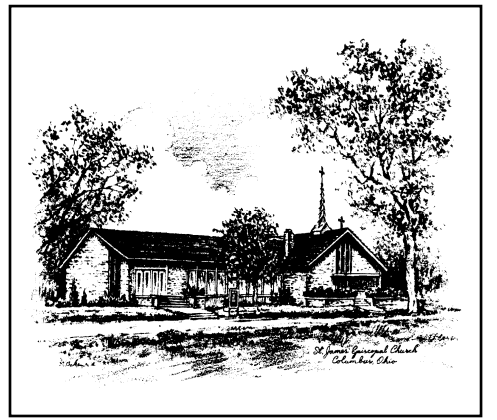

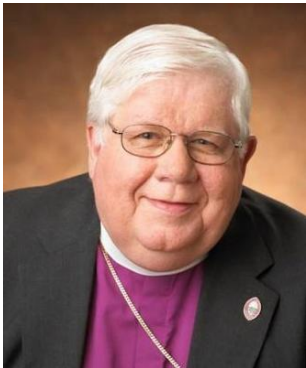

SACRED UNIONS IN THE DIOCESE OF SOUTHERN OHIO

At our diocesan convention last November, Bishop Breidenthal announced that he was lifting the ban on the blessing of same-gender unions in this diocese beginning Easter 2010. The rector and other clergy in our deanery have been meeting to discuss what this means for our congregations. At both masses on Sunday, May 16th, Mother Lynn will be teaching about sacred unions as we have come to understand them in this diocese. Following both masses, there will be a time for questions and discussion in the Lamborne Room. This is a topic of widespread interest as well as confusion, and one that can benefit from some clarity among us all as a congregation. Please make every effort to be here on May 16th.

LAST WEEK'S SUNDAY OFFERING, May 2nd, was \$3,219.00 for general operating expenses, \$58.00 was received for the Rector's Discretionary Fund.

REMINDERS

When using St. James facilities for a meeting or event, please remember that we have no paid janitorial staff and that heat/ac are both very expensive in a building the size of St. James. It will help cut costs and make life easier for us all if we adhere to the following guidelines:

- When finishing an activity turn off the lights.
- If you are the last person out of the building turn off all lights.
- If you notice lights are turned on in a part of the building that is not being used, please turn them off, even if you did not turn them on.
- When leaving the building turn the heat back to 62 degrees and the ac up to 78 degrees.
- While using the building, please do not turn the heat above 68 degrees or the ac below 72 degrees.
- Make sure all doors are locked when you are the last person leaving the building.
- Make sure that you leave any space that you are using in as good or better condition than you found it (ie. chairs pushed in to table, furniture placed neatly, any waste products in appropriate containers, etc.)

B.R.E.A.D. NEHEMIAH ACTION ASSEMBLY SUMMARY

A lot of people connected with the B.R.E.A.D. organization throughout Columbus worked very hard to put together this year's Nehemiah Action Assembly for May 3rd at the Veteran's Memorial Auditorium. Because of their work, commitments were received from Dr Gene Harris to end the practice of suspending students out of school for truancy (there were 4,262 out of school suspensions last year). This is huge. Also, there is a chance to close the deal on getting \$200,000 from the district to expand Project KEY—this would not even be on the table without the Nehemiah Action. Finally, the City, County and County Treasurer went on record to develop a plan for a CLRC to begin to tackle vacant and abandoned housing. None of these things would have happened without the hard work for the Nehemiah Action. Nine people from St James were in attendance. Thanks to Sasha Killewald and Paul Scanlan for organizing our efforts at St James. This annual justice event is geared to change the systems that perpetuate the need for our acts of mercy.
