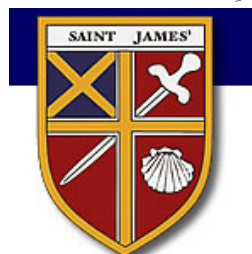
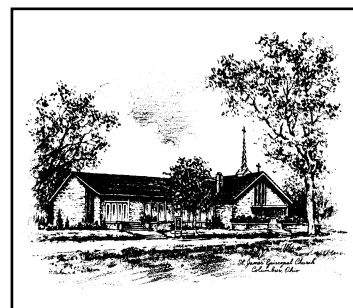


# Around Saint James'...
